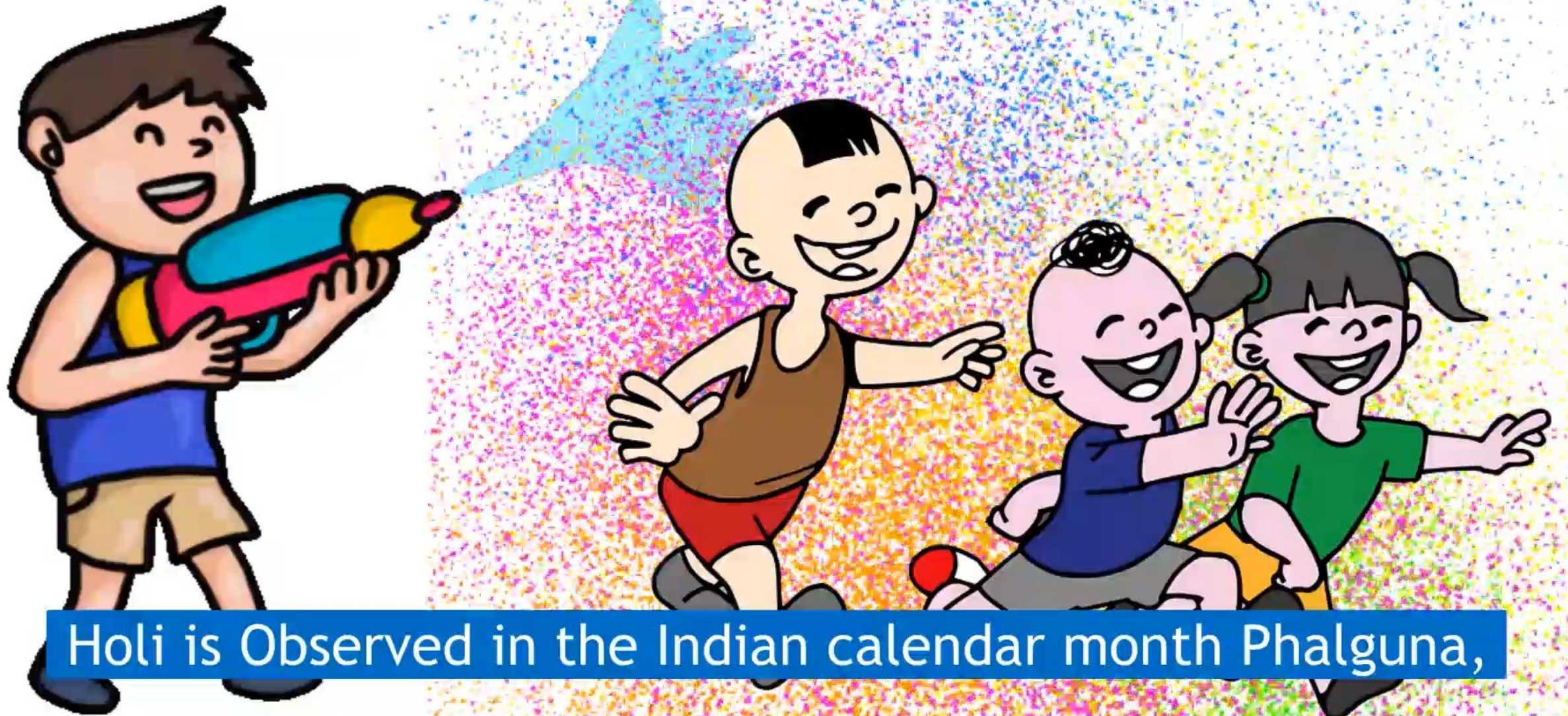

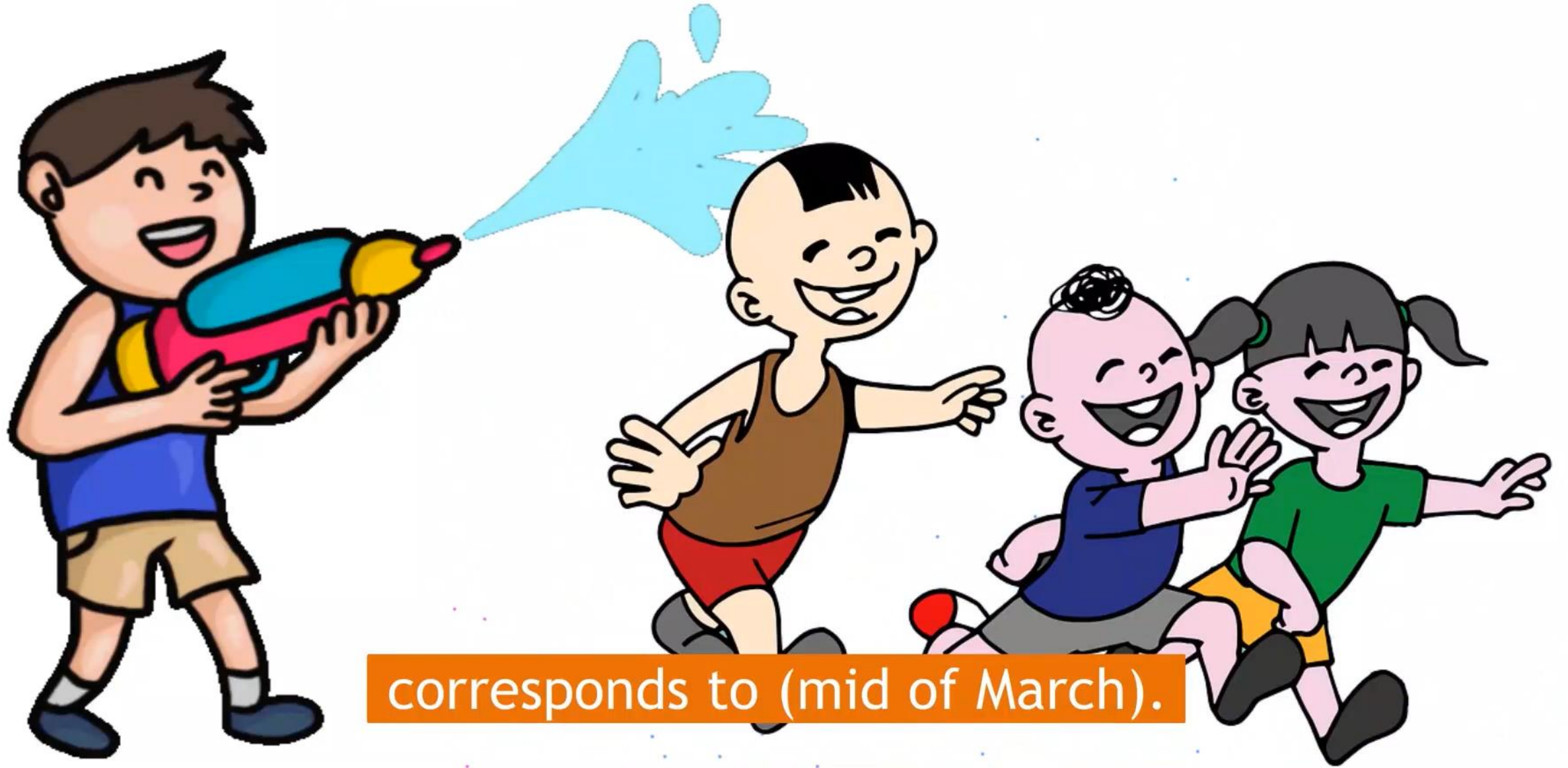
Holi also known as the "Festival of Colours".

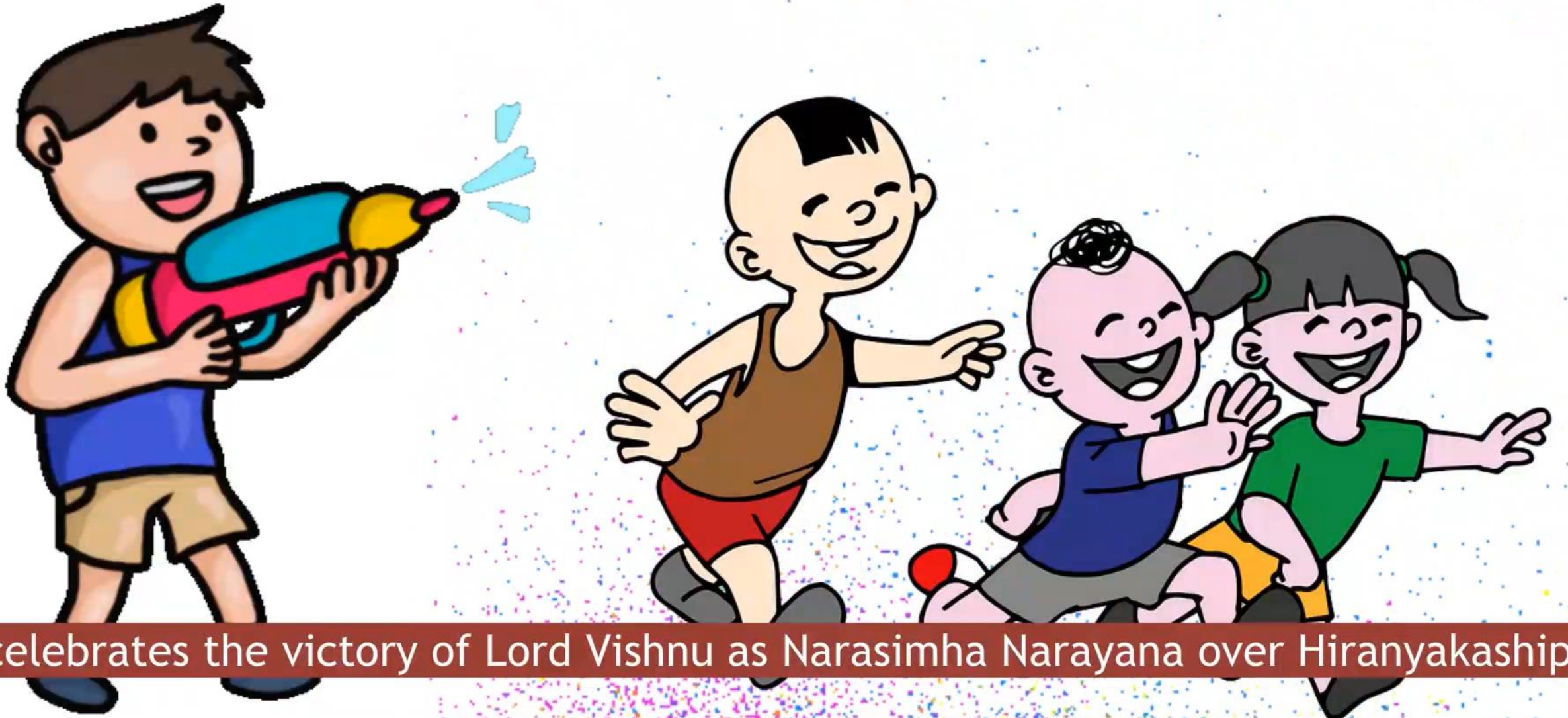
Holi is Observed in the Indian calendar month Phalguna,

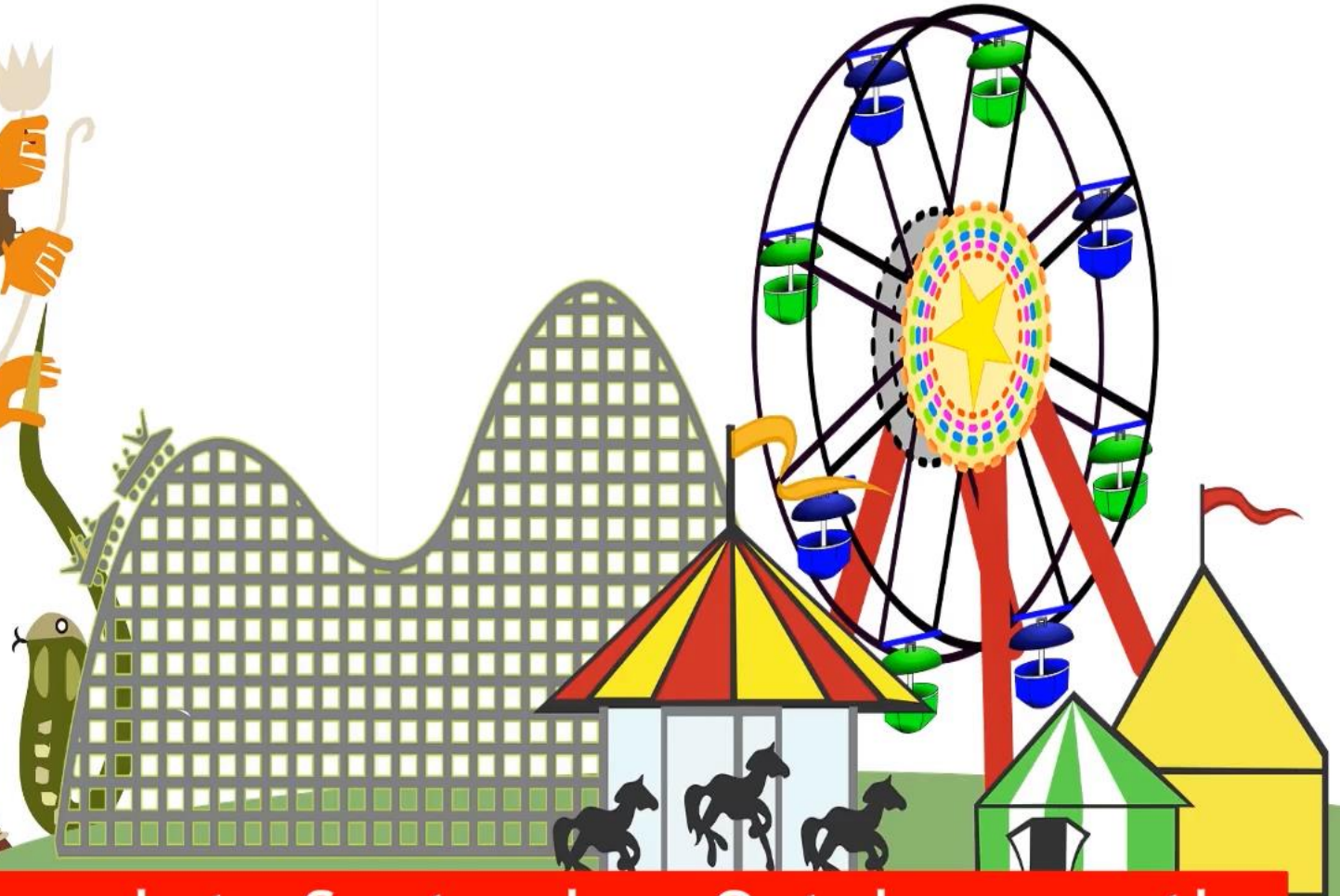
it celebrates the victory of Lord Vishnu as Narasimha Narayana over Hiranyakashipu.

in the Hindu calendar month of Shravan.



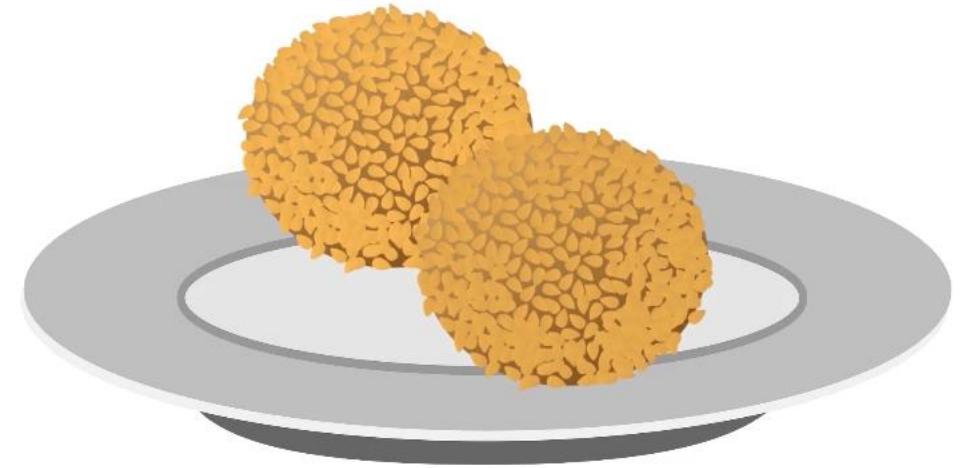
Baisakhi is celebrated on April 13 or April 14 every year.



Vaisakhi is also marking Hindu or Solar New Year and also celebrating the spring harvest.



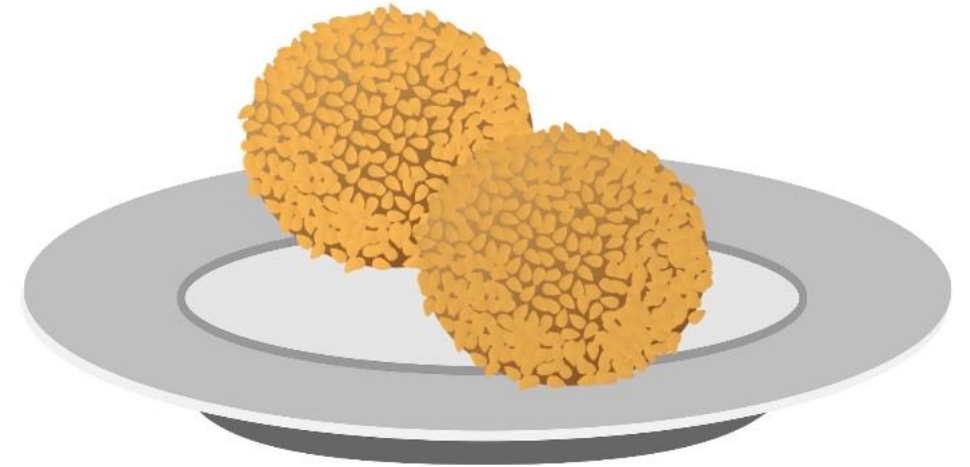
Makar Sankranti

Janmashtami

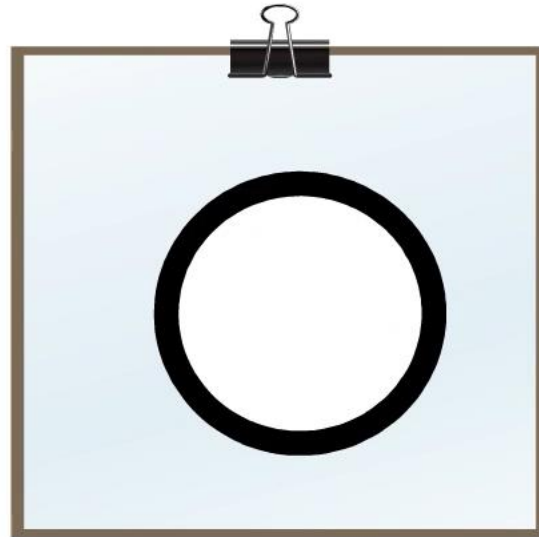


It is celebrated particularly in Mathura and Vrindavan.
