Noun

A noun is a naming word.

It names a person, place, animal, thing,
and feeling. 





Pronoun

A pronoun is a word that replaces a noun.

He, She, It, They, We, Us, Me, You are
some pronouns.

Example

John is my friend. John is a very good boy.

Adjective

Adjective describes the qualities or states of being of nouns.

Clever, fast, slow, long, huge, few etc.

Example

Riya is a beautiful girl
Adjective

Verb

Verb is a doing or action word.

run, sleep, sing, drive, jump, etc.

Example

Riya swims every Monday.

Adverb

An adverb describes a verb, adjective or another adverb.

Words like slowly, loudly, carefully, quickly, quietly, or sadly are all adverbs.

Example

Jack is running.

Jack is running fast.

Preposition

A preposition shows the relation of a person or thing to another word in the sentence.

About, over, from, beside, on, in, and across are examples of prepositions.

Example

The keys are on the table.

Conjunction

Conjunctions are words that join two sentences together.

for, so, but, and, yet, while, either,
because etc.

Example

Davy likes tea. Davy likes coffee

Davy likes tea **and** coffee.



Interjection

Interjection is a word that expresses emotions and feelings.

Yeah! Ah! Oops! Alas! Ouch! Wow!
Hurray! Oh my god!
